HOW DO I JOIN?

- ! Fill out the [BRANCH MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION](#) form. Under Personal Information >> College/University, that is the university from which you graduated.
- ! Be sure to sign under 'eligibility' (an associate's or equivalent, bachelor's, or higher degree from a regionally accredited college or university is required for membership).
- ! Dues will be \$49 to National and \$7 to State – there are no branch dues currently, but you have to pay State dues in order to be considered a branch member. Total: \$56.
- ! **Make check payable to AAUW. Return check and application to Marsha Miller**

WHEN/HOW WILL WE MEET?

No meetings are currently planned but may be announced; initially, as the number of members grows, information will be transmitted electronically. Also, watch for a Facebook page and other methods of communicating.

WHAT WILL WE DO?

We are a branch in the process of re-growth, currently 1 continuing member, 2 Members-at-Large transferring to branch membership, 6 new members and 2 ISU undergraduate e-student affiliate members. We need to figure out what AAUW of the Wabash Valley needs to be, not only to the ISU campus but Terre Haute, the Wabash Valley, and beyond. If we want to do programming, what will we do? How will we raise money for the **AAUW Fund**? Two areas we can plan for now: 1) Bev Bitzegaio is on the Champions Board for the Indiana National Girls Collaborative Project (NGCP). ISU's College of Technology host a statewide conference in the on September 30, 2009. AAUW is affiliated with the NGCP, as is the NSF. 2) \$tart \$mart Wage Negotiation Workshops: Marsha Miller (ISU) and Patricia Crouch (IU-Bloomington) have been trained to conduct these workshops. Cost to host university/college: \$500 to The Wage Project. Patricia has done two workshops in Indiana; we should try to have a workshop scheduled based @ ISU in the Fall.
