Observations / Possibilities for Reducing Expenses

- We've been comfortable approving deficit budgets for the past few years because we've had a significant cushion.
- We currently have about \$2000 in our checking account, about \$1400 in our savings account and \$10,000 in our CD, which matures in Nov. 2015, so funds are available to run a deficit for the next several years.
- **Board voted unanimously to transfer \$640 from savings to checking to make income equal expenses, with no deficit.**
- One way to reduce costs would be to continue to encourage members who have email to receive the Newsletter by email only. Another would be to print and mail fewer Newsletters per year. We've already cut out two months. Could discuss cutting more. (These would save both copying and postage.)
- We could reduce our contribution to Sycamore School.
- We could reduce or eliminate stipends for the national convention, NCCSWL, and other donations.
- We could raise our branch dues and / or do some additional fund-raising. The Crew Car Wash netted \$441 for this 2014-15.
